OFFICIAL STATE OF POLICY

It is the policy of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL to promote the development of strong character, a right attitude, and a sense of responsibility and citizenship in youngsters, using the game of baseball as a vehicle. It is the purpose of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL to achieve this goal through fair play, good sportsmanship, and congenial fellowship, with adult leaders providing the example. It is strictly against the policy of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL for any person, either as a participant or spectator to engage in arguments, to use abusive language, to harass umpires, or to exhibit any behavior not in concert with the general intent of this policy statement. Team coaches are required to abide by this policy statement, and all parents and other adults are strongly encouraged to do so.

All District Directors, after drawing tournament brackets for round-robin, sub-district, and district tournaments, must send the State Director a copy of all brackets.

TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL TOURNAMENT REQUIREMENTS

A. HOSTING FEES

To provide additional working funds for the State Organization, each District Tournament Host will contribute a minimum of \$50.00 per team per tournament to the STATE DIXIE YOUTH Treasury for the privilege of hosting a tournament. These fees must be paid prior to the start of the tournament. These fees apply to Round-Robin and District Tournaments at all levels (A, AA, AAA, and O-Zone).

B. STATE TOURNAMENTS

1. ELIGIBILITY

In order to bid on a State Tournament, a potential Host must have previously hosted a Sub-District or District Tournament in DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL.

2. BIDDING

All applications for Hosting a State Tournament must be submitted in writing to the State Director on or before August 1st of the year PRIOR to the year in which the tournament is to be held. If no application is received, the State Director, with the approval of the State BOARD OF DIRECTORS, will determine the site. Bidding Leagues at the Fall Board meeting must bring (15) information packets for all the State Board members. These packets should have in them specifications of their park, a list of motels with prices (if prices are available), eating places, list of local churches, and other places of interest to the teams.

Leagues will be required to make a presentation to the STATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS at their annual fall board meeting. Inspection of facilities and organization of each bidding League will be made by the State Organization prior to this presentation. A final inspection of the Host site will be made no later than thirty (30) days prior to the beginning of the State Tournament. To receive a State Tournament, a majority of votes cast by the Board of Directors at the Board meeting (held at annual fall meeting) will be necessary; if no one League receives a majority of votes cast, a run-off will be held between the top two (2) Leagues plus any ties for the two (2) top positions.

3. ROTATION OF STATE TOURNAMENTS

- a. All State Tournaments will rotate in the following order: EAST - MIDDLE - WEST.
- b. The East Region will be composed of Districts 6,7, and 8. The Middle Region will be composed of Districts 1, 4, and 5. The West Region will be composed of Districts 2 and 3.
- c. Division I and Division II State Tournaments for AA, AAA, and O-Zone will be set by the State Board of Directors. Host for these tournaments will be selected by the State Board at their Fall meeting. Class A (5-6) will be a combined Division I and II state Tournament.
- d. When Districts do not send a team or teams to the State Tournament, the State Director will select the team or teams to fill vacant slots.

4. REQUIREMENTS TO BE MET BY THE HOST OF A TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH STATE TOURNAMENT. A STATE TOURNAMENT HOST MUST:

A. EXPENSES

- 1) Pay to the State Organization hosting fees: \$50.00 per team up to a maximum of \$800.00 for 16 teams.
- 2) Pay to the State Organization the cost of a championship flag and official T-Shirts for the Division I and II State Championship team and coaches. Division I and II O-Zone will have two sets each. One O-Zone champion and one Major champion in each division.
- 3) Pay to the State Organization the cost of the following team and individual awards and other items.
 - a) Championship---Team plaque and individual Championship rings.
 - b) Runner-Up---Team plaque and individual trophies or medallions. (Host responsible for additional trophies, plaques or medallions if there are two runner-ups)

- c) Sportsmanship---Team plaque and individual medallions or trophies for players and coaches.
- d) Participation---medallions for all players and coaches (every team).
- e) Line-up cards to be purchased and provided by the State.
- 4) Pay an expense allowance to the Tournament Director, included on the State Tournament Invoice, the per diem not to exceed \$75.00 per day.
- 5) The first day of every tournament in Tennessee, the Host will collect \$1.00 for every paid attendance. This money will be used for the National Scholarship Fund. Each day after, \$1.00 will be collected for every paid attendance and it will be designated for the Tennessee Awards Fund to be given back to the Districts as the State Board approves. This money will be collected by the Host and forwarded to the Scholarship Chairman with a State Invoice filled out with a daily attendance figure. Failure to get this to the Scholarship Chairman by August 1st will result in the hosting league's forfeit to host a tournament for two years and a \$750.00 fine.

B. HOSPITALITY/ENTERTAINMENT

- 1) Furnish each team with a schedule of entertainment available, such as admission to theaters, swimming pools, bowling centers, recreation centers, mini-golf, etc.
- 2) You must provide players and coaches with lanyard type ribbons and with passes. Each coach will receive two (2) passes only.
- 3) Provide a birthday cake or 12 cup cakes for a player or players having a birthday during the tournament. This information will be furnished by the Tournament Director. It is suggested that the cake or cupcakes be presented to the player at home plate following his/her team's game on their birthday.
- 4) Provide all participants, including managers/coaches, with a souvenir package. These packages should contain any type of inexpensive gift or souvenir from the area or any item that the host wishes to provide.
- 5) If a meal is to be provided before or after Opening Ceremonies, this must be approved by the State Board at the time of the bid process. Any changes after approval must be submitted to the State Director for approval.
- 6) Any activities by the State Tournament Host the day before or the day of the State Tournament must be approved by the State Board at the time of the bidding process or no later than the Spring meeting.

C. PUBLICITY/CEREMONIES

- 1) Publish a Tournament program or a Tournament Poster containing pictures of competing teams. If a program is published, it may include Tennessee State Board pictures, tournament pairings, and an official letter from the State Director.
- 2) Arrange to display the American flag, the Tennessee State flag and the flags of each District competing in the State Tournament.
- 3) Arrange for local news media to give the Tournament coverage in local papers.
- 4) The invocation must be given and the National Anthem played at the beginning of each session of play. Proper patriotic and spiritual emphasis must be given all activities of the Tournament.
- 5) Provide an opening ceremony that is approximately 30 minutes in length as approved by the Tournament Director. These ceremonies will be held at the playing field to be used during the Series unless prior approval is granted by the Tournament Director. It is suggested that only the necessary minimum number of politicians be introduced. Dixie Youth officials in attendance will be introduced.

D. PLAYING FIELD(S) / FACILITIES

- 1) Provide a playing field(s) meeting Dixie Youth Baseball specifications as illustrated in the Dixie Youth Rule Guide. Dugouts, sideline fencing and an electronic scoreboard must be provided.
- 2) Provide press box facilities large enough to accommodate the official scorer, public address announcer, scoreboard operator, and other officials as approved by the Tournament Director. Dugouts, sideline fencing and an electronic scoreboard must be provided.

*ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS APPROVED BY THE TOURNAMENT
DIRECTOR WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE PRESS BOX.*

- 3) Furnish a public address system that will give complete audio coverage to every part of the stadium. A back-up system must be immediately available.
- 4) Provide adequate seating accommodations for a minimum of 500 spectators, at the game site. A daily admission fee will be charged. This fee is set by the State Board. Different colored wrist bands or tickets are to be used daily.
- 5) Public rest rooms must be near the field(s) and there must be a minimum of four available units, at least two for men and two for ladies.
- 6) Provide ample parking space near the park at no charge.
- 7) Provide a first-aid station with a medical doctor, registered nurse or other trained medical personnel on duty during all sessions. Provide a number of a doctor on call for emergencies for visiting participants and officials.
- 8) Provide police and security personnel during all games.
- 9) For all Tennessee Dixie Youth Baseball State Tournaments the TSSAA heat index rule will be in effect.
- 10) After each game is played during the tournament, the chalked or painted line will be relined, and if playing on a dirt infield, the playing surface will be raked or drug.

E. MISCELLANEOUS REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Provide competent umpires for all games. The umpires **MUST** be: approved by the Tournament Director prior to the start of the Tournament. They should have experience in working Dixie Youth games and should have previous tournament experience. The Dixie Youth Baseball patch is the only patch that will be allowed on their uniform during the Tournament. The host league will be responsible for the payment of umpiring fees to the umpires working the State Tournament. All umpires working the State Tournament must attend a meeting with the Tournament Director prior to the start of the State Tournament.
- 2) Home run balls are to be retrieved, if possible, and presented to the hitter on the field following the game in which it was hit. The game ball will likewise be presented to any pitcher who pitches a no-hit game.
- 3) Leagues bidding for the opportunity to host a Tennessee Dixie Youth State Tournament must state in their bid if any other tournaments or activities are planned during the same period in which the tournament they are bidding on is being held.
- 4) A large tournament bracket showing the pairings must be displayed at the site of the State Tournament.
- 5) A package showing motel locations, directions to the park, and other general information must be presented at the spring meeting.
- 6) If a "Hospitality Room" is offered by the Host League, its use must be offered to all DYB officials. It is recommended that "Hospitality Room" refreshments, if any, be restricted to coffee, juice and/or soft drinks and not go beyond very light snacks. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED AT ANY FUNCTION OF DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL.**
- 7) Ball cubes are to be purchased by the Host League to be used for Homeruns and No-Hit games in the AA, AAA, and O-Zone tournaments.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF PLAYERS/MANAGERS/COACHES

- a. Managers are required to attend all meetings set by the Tournament Director. If a manager does not come to the coaches meeting, the opening ceremonies or does not have all team's ball players present, they will be suspended for the first game and banned from the playing field for that game. Prior approval must be given from the Tournament Director for any player or coach to be absent from Opening Ceremonies.
- b. Players must be housed with Parents or "Guardians" at the Site of the State Tournament or commute to their legal residence.

- c. All Players are expected to display good sportsmanship, and the adults are expected to set the example. If a manager, coach, or assistant is ejected from a Tournament game by an umpire, they will be ineligible to manage, coach, or in any way participate in any phase of their team's activity for the remainder of the Tournament. Any manager/coach who is ejected by the umpire will be subject to returning to the team by the Tournament Director's approval. The Tournament Director may give the team involved authority to replace such a suspended person.
- d. All managers/coaches must wear a baseball uniform or long slacks identical in style and color and uniform shirt or polo shirt with collar with athletic shoes (full protective footwear-No sandals or flip flops.) Baseball hats are required while on the field. The team manager will be suspended until coaches are properly dressed.
- e. Each tournament team is required to have present at each tournament game except that any unfilled player vacancy or a player's absence may be approved by the Tournament Director for justifiable reasons.
 - (Class A) 12 players, manager, and 3 coaches
 - (Division I AA) 12 players, manager, and 3 coaches
 - (Division I AAA & O-Zone) 12 players, manager, and 2 coaches
 - (Division II AA) 11 players, manager, and 3 coaches
 - (Division II AAA & O-Zone) 11 players, manager, and 2 coaches

The Tournament Director may suspend a team manager from participating in any game where a player vacancy or absence cannot be justified. The Tournament Director may require a team to replace a player whose continued participation on the team is in doubt.
- f. All managers and coaches must have a **concussion training certificate, cardiac arrest certificate, and a background check paper** signed by the League President included in their tournament paperwork. This requirement is for Round-Robin, District, State and World Series Tournaments. This must be done prior to their first game. PENALTY: Not allowed to manage or coach the team until this requirement is met.
- g. The State Board recommends that if you have a female player on your team, have a female adult in the dugout with the female player.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF STATE ORGANIZATION

- a. All uniforms for teams going to a World Series will have Tennessee as the team name on the front of the jerseys. It is recommended that the uniforms be orange and white.
- b. Tennessee will send the required number of teams to the Division I and II World Series. The State Board will set the requirements to select the AA, AAA, and O-Zone representatives. Division I and II O-Zone will send the Champion to the O-Zone World Series and the Runner-Up to the Majors World Series.
- c. If any team or teams decline to advance to either Division I or II World Series, the State Director will select the team or teams to replace them.
- d. Division I and II Coach-Pitch Sportsmanship Award shall be known as the *George Pinner Sportsmanship Award*. Division I and II O-Zone Sportsmanship Award shall be known as the *Nick Senter Sportsmanship Award*.

C. DISTRICT/SUB-DISTRICT TOURNAMENTS (ALL DIVISIONS)

1. ROTATION OF DISTRICT/SUB-DISTRICT TOURNAMENTS

All District and Sub-District Tournaments must be offered to all Leagues on an alphabetical rotation system provided the League's facilities meet Tournament specifications. A League may turn down its opportunity to host the Tournament and in so doing will have to wait until all Leagues have had an opportunity to host the Tournament before they are again eligible to act as Tournament Host. If a League receives a Sub-District or a District Tournament due to a League turning down or passing on an opportunity to host for any reason, this will count as the League that got the passed tournament turn in the alphabetical rotation system. In cases where two (2) or more Leagues are operating within the same boundaries or using common playing facilities, these will not be eligible to host the Tournament a second time until all other Leagues have had an opportunity to act as Tournament Host. If no League accepts or

qualifies for the Tournament(s), the District Director, with the approval of the State Director, will determine the site(s).

The use of Round-Robin Tournaments for Sub-District and District Tournaments will not have the State Option to use. The Tournament director will follow the notes to run the tournament.

2. REQUIREMENTS OF HOST

- a. Provide a playing field that conforms to specifications as outlined in the official DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL Rule Guide.
- b. Furnish Approved DIXIE YOUTH Baseballs.
- c. Provide adequate restroom facilities
- d. Provide qualified Umpires for the Tournament. These will be selected by the District Director with the provision that at least one Umpire selected be from the District/Sub-District involved.
- e. Provide team awards as follows:
 - 1) Championship Award.
 - 2) Runner-up Award.
 - 3) Sportsmanship Award.

The Sportsmanship Award shall be determined by the conduct of the players, managers, and the action of their fans.
- f. Pay to the DIXIE YOUTH State Treasury the applicable Tournament Hosting fee.
- g. All Round-Robin and District tournament admission fees will be a daily charge. Tickets or wrist bands are to be given out daily to all paying admissions. These should be a different color daily.

3. REQUIREMENTS OF ALL TOURNAMENT TEAMS IN DISTRICT PLAY

Present a color 5"x 7" glossy picture or an electronic picture of the team, properly identifying players & coaches as shown in the picture, with the correct number of coaches and ball players, to the District Director prior to the start of the District Tournament. **PENALTY:** No team will be allowed to participate until their team picture is presented to the District Director.

TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The Officers and Directors shall constitute the BOARD OF DIRECTORS and act as the administrative body for all franchised DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL Leagues in Tennessee.

ARTICLE III - GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRICTS

The territory embracing the Leagues shall be divided into two (2) or more geographical districts as determined by the Board of Directors and approved by the Leagues.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

- A. The Officers and Directors of this organization shall be:
 1. The State Director.
 2. The Assistant State Director.
 3. The District Directors.
 4. The National Directors of Tennessee.
- B. The State Director shall also serve as the Treasurer and the Assistant State Director shall serve as the Secretary of the organization.
- C. Each elected member of the Board of Directors will be entitled to one (1) vote on all matters before the Board of Directors.
- D. With the exception of school leagues, the Dixie Boys Program or the Dixie Softball Program, no National Director, State Director, Assistant State Director, District Director, or Assistant District director shall be permitted to participate in an official capacity in any other organized youth baseball program.

ARTICLE V - METHOD OF ELECTION

- A. The State Director shall be elected by the Franchised Leagues within the State of Tennessee as described in the Dixie Youth Baseball Constitution and Bylaws.
- B. The Assistant State Director shall be elected by the Franchised Leagues within the State of Tennessee at the Annual State Meeting. Each League represented shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote. Elected 2002 and every 3 years after.
- C. The District Directors shall be elected by the Franchised Leagues of their respective Districts represented at the Districts annual meeting. Each League represented shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote. The Assistant Director will be selected by the District Director. Elected 2003 and every 3 years after.
- D. Vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled for the unexpired terms by the remaining Directors until such time as an election is held for the purpose of electing a replacement.
- E. The three National Directors shall be elected one from each region; East, Middle, and West. The National Director must live in the Region he/she is elected to.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

- A. An annual State Meeting of the Board of Directors and the Franchised Leagues of Tennessee will be held each year.
- B. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the State Director or by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors. By unanimous consent, such meetings may be held without notice.
- C. A quorum for the transaction of business at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors shall consist of at least half of the members of the Board. A majority of those present shall have the power to adjourn the meeting to a future time.
- D. The Directors may establish as many committees as they declare necessary and may appoint members of the Board of Directors to serve thereon.

- E. Only a duly authorized representative of a franchised league is allowed to vote in any matter before district or state meetings. No one person can represent more than one league. A duly authorized representative of a league is the league president or a person designated by him in writing who is active currently in the voting league.

ARTICLE VII- THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. The Board of Directors shall act in an advisory capacity to the State Director; shall entertain and cause to be thoroughly investigated any written complaints against DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL within the State of Tennessee and shall take whatever action it may deem advisable.
- B. The Board of Directors shall have full power to adopt all regulations to govern the Boards deliberations so long as they comply with the rules, policies, intent, and regulations of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL, INC.
- C. The Board of Directors shall have full power to establish all Tournament Requirements for all Divisions of Tennessee Dixie Youth Baseball so long as they do not conflict with the rules, policies, intent, and regulations of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL, INC.
- D. The Board of Directors shall have full power to prohibit any individual whose conduct reflects unfavorably on DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL from participating in any DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL program in the State of Tennessee.

ARTICLE VIII- GENERAL

The qualifications for membership and duties of Officers and Directors, and regulations as may be necessary and proper for the conduct of the business and affairs of TENNESSEE DIXIE BASEBALL shall be provided for in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE IX- AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

This Constitution may be amended at any meeting by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the Leagues present, provided the copies of the amendment shall have been mailed to each League at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the meeting at which the vote is to be taken.

TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1- STATE DIRECTOR

The State Director:

- 1. Shall preside at all State Meetings;
- 2. Shall be in "General Control" of all Franchised Leagues;
- 3. Shall work closely with the Officers and Directors of TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL;
- 4. May direct correspondence to the various Leagues and require same from them;
- 5. Shall conduct all business in behalf of the Organization;
- 6. Shall make every effort to further the policy adopted by the BOARD OF DIRECTORS;
- 7. Shall issue notice of all State Meetings;
- 8. Shall be responsible for receiving proposed changes to the Class A rules, and submitting them to the Tennessee BOARD OF DIRECTORS at the Fall State Board Meeting;
- 9. Shall fulfill the job duties as prescribed by DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL, INC.

ARTICLE 11-ASSISTANT STATE DIRECTOR

The Assistant State Director:

- 1. Shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors.
- 2. Shall keep the minutes of annual meetings and other called State meetings.
- 3. Shall preside at all State Meetings in the absence of the State Director.
- 4. Shall assume the duties of the State Director in the event of a vacancy until such time an election is held for the purpose of electing a replacement.
- 5. Shall serve as the Tournament Director of a State Tournament as appointed by the state Director.

6. Shall be responsible along with the State Director in sending copies of minutes of Board meetings, Annual meetings, and called meetings to each member of the Board of Directors and each Franchised League.

ARTICLE III- SECRETARY

The Secretary:

1. Shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the BOARD OF DIRECTORS;
2. Shall mail to each member of the BOARD OF DIRECTORS a copy of the minutes after each official meeting;
3. Shall keep the minutes of annual meetings and other called State meetings;
4. Shall send copies of minutes of annual meetings and called meetings to each member of the BOARD OF DIRECTORS and each Franchised League.

ARTICLE IV- TREASURER

The Treasurer:

1. Shall collect all fees and dues with the help of the Commissioner of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL, INC;
2. Shall make authorized disbursements;
3. Shall carry the funds of the organization in a reputable bank in the name of the Organization;
4. Shall sign all checks;
5. Shall issue a financial report at the Annual State Meeting.

ARTICLE V- DISTRICT DIRECTOR

A. The District Director:

1. Shall preside at all meetings of his respective District;
2. Shall maintain a current map showing League boundaries;
3. Shall maintain a current roster of Franchised Leagues;
4. Shall conduct all business in behalf of the District;
5. Shall make every effort to further the policy adopted by the District;
6. Shall be directly responsible for the District and Sub-District Tournaments within his District;
7. Shall fulfill the job duties as prescribed by DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL, INC.

B. The Assistant District Director:

1. Shall assist all Leagues as directed by the District Director;
2. Shall assume control at District Meetings in the absence of the District Director;
3. Will only vote on matters at the BOARD OF DIRECTORS Meetings in the absence of the District Director.

ARTICLE VI- QUALIFICATIONS

To hold the office of State Director, Assistant State Director, or District Director, one must have been associated with DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL for at least one (1) year.

ARTICLE VII- TENURE OF OFFICE

- A. The term of office of the State Director shall be (4) years and Assistant State Director shall be three (3) years.
- B. The term of office of the District Directors and Assistant District Directors shall be three (3) years and will assume their positions when elected.
- C. The term of office of the Secretary and the Treasurer shall be for three years being at the date of their selection.
- D. The State Director, all District Directors, and all Assistant District Directors will assume office as set by the National Board of Dixie Youth Baseball and/or the State Board of Tennessee Dixie Youth Baseball.
- E. Following a written complaint, a District Director or an Assistant District Director whose conduct reflects unfavorably on TENNESSEE DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL or who is derelict in his duties may be removed from office. The State Director shall appoint a committee to investigate the complaint; except, if the State Director is being charged in the complaint, the Senior National Director of Tennessee shall appoint the committee. If the investigation warrants further action, the

State BOARD OF DIRECTORS shall have the power to remove said individual from the program. The investigating Committee shall consist of at least three (3) people not including the individual making the complaint.

ARTICLE VIII- STATE MEETINGS

An Annual State Meeting will be held at a place designated by the State Director. The State Director or the BOARD OF DIRECTORS may call State Meetings at such other times as may be necessary.

ARTICLE IX- FINANCES

- A. The BOARD OF DIRECTORS and the Franchised Leagues shall determine the Tennessee State Franchise Fees.
- B. A State Franchise fee of \$50.00 shall be charged per Major League, to be paid to the State Treasurer. These funds will be used by the BOARD OF DIRECTORS for expenses incurred in promotion and operation of DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL in the State of Tennessee.
- C. A penalty of \$1.00 per day per Major League will be imposed on the Leagues who are late filing their Application for Franchise Renewal, with the penalty starting on the day after the deadline for turning in Franchise Renewals.
- D. All Directors shall be reimbursed for all reasonable expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties, upon approval by the State Director. Any unusual expenses will be subject to approval by the BOARD OF DIRECTORS. Mileage will be paid roundtrip.

ARTICLE X- IMPORTANT DATES

The BOARD OF DIRECTORS shall determine all dates that are incidental to the beginning of a season and the operation thereof.

ARTICLE XI- GENERAL

- A. District or Sub-District Tournaments will start no later than the date(s) set by the BOARD OF DIRECTORS at the Annual State Meeting.
- B. An Invocation and the playing of the National Anthem are to be a scheduled part of all DIXIE YOUTH BASEBALL Tournaments prior to their opening daily game(s).
- C. No DYB officials, elected or appointed shall serve as a tournament director or any other official capacity in tournaments in which he/she manages or coaches in any tournament in which his/her team participates including any time after his/her team is eliminated from the tournament. **EXCEPTION:** No National Board member, elected or appointed, shall be eligible to manage or coach a tournament team under any circumstances.
- D. The BOARD OF DIRECTORS shall receive all recommendations concerning changes or additions to State Policies and Regulations by 9:00 a.m. on the day of the BOARD OF DIRECTORS meeting at the Annual State Meeting. The BOARD OF DIRECTORS shall recommend its findings at the General Meeting. If the BOARD OF DIRECTORS recommends adoption, upon a motion from the floor, a vote will be taken. If the BOARD OF DIRECTORS recommends rejection of the proposal, the sponsoring party will be allowed three (3) minutes to present their view, and may move for a vote.

ARTICLE XII-AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Bylaws may be made by a majority vote of the Franchised Leagues present at any meeting, or at any special meeting, provided copies of the proposed Changes have been mailed to each Franchised League at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the meeting at which the vote is to be taken.
